Brief introduction of 5 to 10 minutes about European SchoolNet and the role of Scientix in ensuring the sustainability of European educational projects once their funding period has ended.

Some questions to address during the presentation could be:

- What tools are being developed at the European level to facilitate the implementation of new pedagogical methodologies generated by European projects (such as the one developed by OTTER)?
- Are there mechanisms or entities that enable developers of educational content to access European policymakers to facilitate the implementation of such methodologies in Europe?
- Do European educational institutions listen to educational content creators? Are the contents generated in European projects reviewed by these institutions? What spaces for dialogue exist, if any?

16:30 to 16:40

Brief dissertation by **SPEAKERS 3 & 4: Ray D'Arcy & Ciara Breen**

Principal & 6th class teacher in Scoil Ide, Ireland (a pilot school of OTTER Labs). Brief introduction of about 5 minutes each on how the process of implementing an OTTER lab in the school and practicing Education Outside the Classroom was.

Some questions to address during the presentation could be:

About the project implementation from the management perspective (Ray);

• what encouraged you to agree for your school to be involved, what did success look like form your point of view, what changes (if any) would you advise if you were to get involved again.

And also, from the teaching perspective (Ciara);

• in what way was OTTER innovative, what did success look like from your point of view, what were the key ingredients for successful implementation, any lessons learned from your experience?

Some extra questions to discuss:

• What difficulties have you encountered when organising an Education Outside the Classroom activity like this?

• What changes or improvements, at the administrative and/or bureaucratic level, could be made to facilitate educational institutions in carrying out these types of EOC activities?

• Is there flexibility in adapting the educational curriculum to EOC activities?

• Policy for EOC:

Beyond the Policy Brief DRAFT, what strategies can be employed to ensure that the recommendations for EOC in the Policy Brief are taken into account by policymakers at both national and EU levels?

• Scaling EOC and OTTER Labs Globally:

While the focus is on Europe, how can the EOC in general, and OTTER Labs model in particular, be scaled globally, and what considerations should be taken into account when adapting it to different educational contexts worldwide?
